Eligibility:	<p>Level 2: White - Yellow Belt (nov-6th mon) Group 1: Male age 8-11 Group 2: Male age 12-15 Group 3: Females (will be split by age into pools on the day)</p> <p>Level 2: Orange-Green Belt (7th – 12th mon) Group 4: Male age 8-11 Group 5: Male age 12-15 Group 6: Females (will be split by age into pools on the day)</p> <p>Level 3: Senior (14+ years old) Group 7: Male and Female nov - yellow belt (nov-5th kyu) Group 8: Male and Female orange – blue belt (4th – 2nd kyu) Group 9: Male and Female brown & black belts (1st kyu and above- not points scoring)</p> <p>All players must hold a license to British Judo Association, JudoScotland, Welsh Judo, Northern Ireland Judo or an affiliated association (e.g British Judo Council). Please bring physical book with license card/slip and proof of grade.</p> <p>Club Champions: Every player winning a medal will gain points towards a leaderboard for Club Champions. There will be a Junior and Senior Club Champion announced. Points as follows: Gold medal 10 points, silver medal 7 points and bronze medal 5 points A prize of £100 for the Junior and to the Senior Club Champions</p>
Weight Categories:	<p>Weight</p> <p>Groups 1-6</p> <p>All competitors will be weighed in and split into pools of 4 or 5 if possible, please give approximate weight on entry form to allow us to form pools. We do not expect anyone to 'cut' weight or 'run-off' for this event- it is an entry level event.</p> <p>We expect to run weight groups closest to the weight categories in Minor/Pre-Cadet competition.</p> <p>Groups 7-9</p> <p>Men -60kg, -66kg, -73kg, -81kg, -90kg, -100kg, +100kg Women -52kg, -57kg, -63kg, -70kg, -78kg, +78kg</p> <p>If there are low entries, we will contact players to discuss combining grade categories/forming open weight categories. We reserve the right to merge weight categories within reason in Groups 7-9.</p>

Players should bring their own blue & white belts, although some will be provided.</p> <p>Technical Restrictions: BJA Technical Restrictions will apply for groups 1, 4 and in 3 and 6 where age requires. No kansetsu-waza or shime-waza in groups 1-6.</p> <p>Coaching: Permitted through out and positive encouragement for all players is welcome.</p>
Weigh-In:	<p>Group 1, 2, 3, & 6: 8.30-9am Group 4 & 5:10-10.30am Groups 7,8 & 9: 1-1.30pm</p> <p>Weigh-in will be open. All competitors must wear contest judogi trousers and a t-shirt to weigh-in, an allowance of 0.8kg will be added for all players.</p> <p>Confirmation of weigh in time will be given once entries have closed, the above is a guideline.</p>
Officials	<p>Trainee official may be used for this event under supervision. Please be conscious of this and make every effort to encourage their participation. Any player not eligible to compete is welcome to try refereeing/timekeeping on the day, please let us know in advance if you are bringing any such players.</p>
